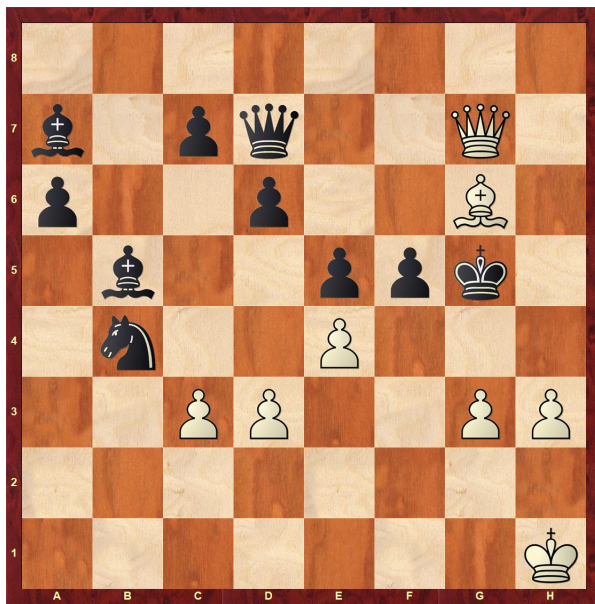

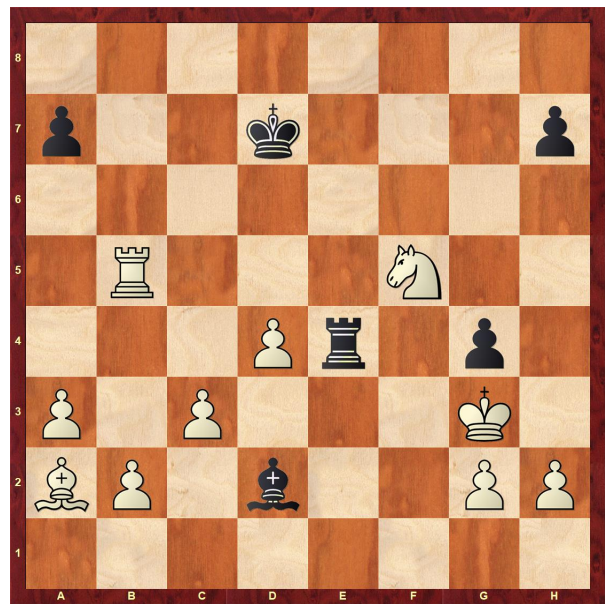


Top Left & Top Right: U8 Section
Bottom: U10 Section

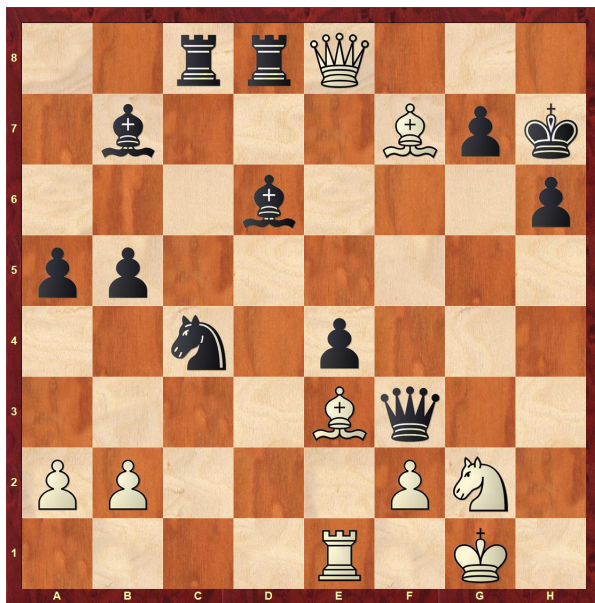

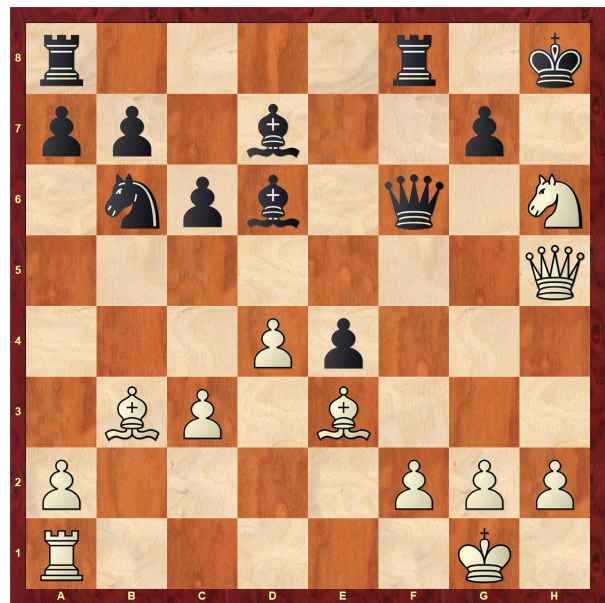
1. White to play and mate in 1



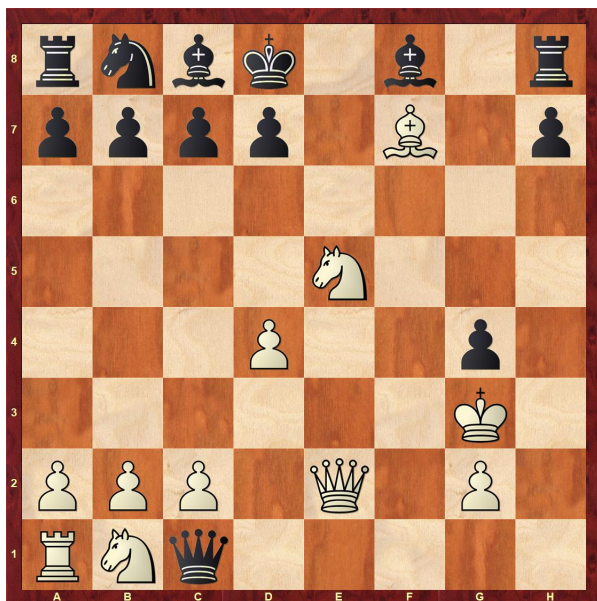
2. Black to play and mate in 1



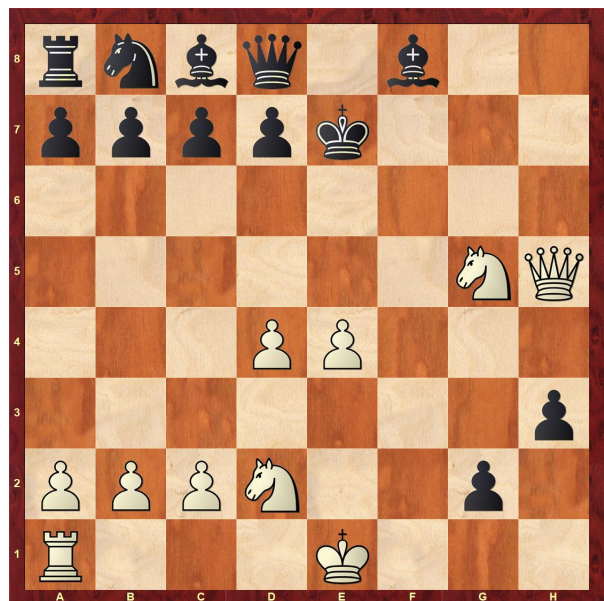
3. White to play and mate in 1

The Alberta Chess Challenge will be hosting players from all over Alberta. The tournament is divided into 12 sections based on grade. Section winners will represent team Alberta at the 2018 Canadian Chess Challenge. The ACA will provide a \$650 travel grant to help offset expenses for travel to St. John's, Newfoundland for the May 19-21 tournament.
