Chess school is a great way to gain new chess skills and test them out in a tournament setting.

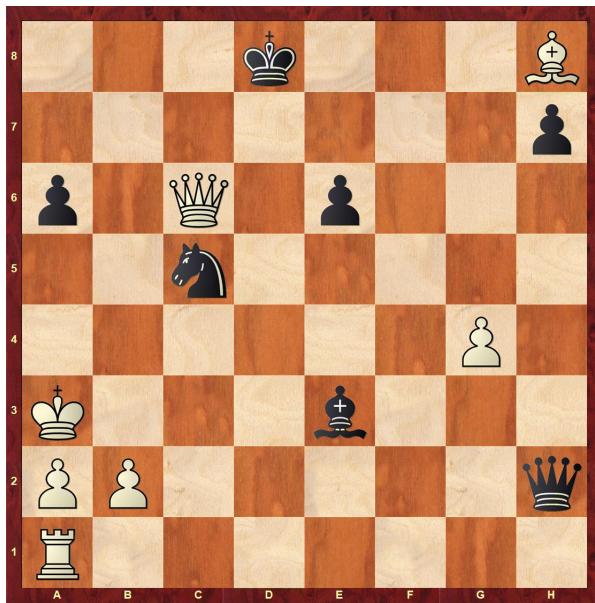

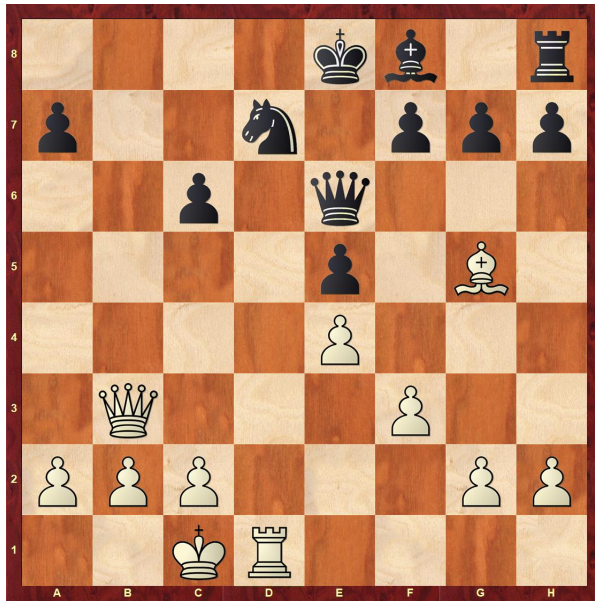

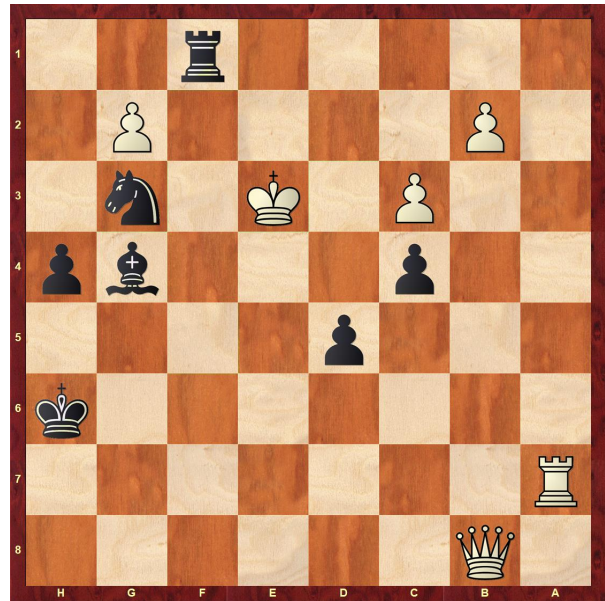
3. Black to play, mate in 1
